Buckley, editor of the conservative National Review, said "I'm not surprised that there should be factions, but I'm not here either to comment on them." Buckley, who helped organize YAF in 1960, received a rousing welcome from about 1,000 delegates during a speech Thursday

At a news conference earlier, Buckley, citing San Francisco State, said he thought some colleges face destruction.

"It seems to me that any college where order is maintained by the National Guard is at least on the brink of destruction," Buckley said. "But by destruction I mean, of course, a situation in which the people one feels most about leave."

He explained he meant the migration of 20 or 25 key professors who leave during demonstrations.
