Group Aims to Prevent Coercion-Spokesman

Young Americans for Freedom, a self-proclaimed "positive action group," has opened a local office at 6010 Freret.

Evan Soule, a Tulane University junior who is YAF's Louisiana vice-chairman, said the group stands for "freedom from coercion of any sort, be it from the far right or the far left.

"We intend to educate students to the values of a libertarian philosophy," he said.

Soule d e c l a r e d that the g r o u p, which conservative spokesman William F. Buckley Jr. founded in 1960, also stands for a voluntary form of military service. YAF has a national membership of about 50,000.
