

# Sirhan Trial Discrepancy Is Conceded

Attorney General J. Younger acknowledged yesterday there were "minor inconsistencies" in the trial of Sirhan B. for the murder of Sen. Robert F. Kennedy and "I am not disturbed by them."

Younger, Los Angeles county prosecutor, issued a memorandum in which he said he took all reasonable measures to insure that the truth was developed and reported.

He said, "It was inevitable that the conspiracy would be suggested - makes a better story."

## AWAY

Younger was out of state and could not be reached for further comment, his office said. Sirhan is on San Quentin Prison's death row. His appeal of his death sentence is pending.

The Los Angeles County Grand Jury has been investigating whether evidence in the case, including the alleged murder weapon and bullets, were tampered with.

District Attorney J. Busch Jr., who is Younger's successor, asked for further investigation, saying he was "terribly concerned" about "evidence that exhibits have been directly handled by numerous persons."
