

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Dear Mr. Weisberg,

I am just writing to thank you for spending the afternoon with me last month. I greatly appreciated it and I enjoyed speaking to one of the forefathers of the Warren Report critics. I have followed up on a lot of what you said and have spoken to Robert Grodin, officially joined the Assassination Archives, and sent Chip Selby a request for a copy of his thesis.

My thesis is going well and I expect to begin writing it very soon. I recently sent a letter to Bob Richter, the producer of NOVA, criticizing the program, "Who Shot J.F.K.".
