I very much enjoyed the time we were able to spend together a short time ago. Hopefully on my next trip we will be able to discuss matters a little longer. I shall be in Washington again from March 27-April 6.

Enclosed are your copies of the "JFK" and "Ruby" scripts as well as copies of two Eleventh Circuit Court of Appeals cases on the Liberty Lobby lawsuit discussed in Lane's new book. First, thank you very much for allowing me to photocopy the two scripts. I appreciated it a great deal. Second, I think you will find the two cases very interesting. Lane was not the attorney of record for the first case, but both cases cover the details set out in his new book. As you were correct to point out, the case in no way indicates that the CIA murdered President Kennedy. All it indicates is that Hunt failed to prove that Liberty Lobby published the article with actual malice intended or had a reason to believe the accusations involved were fundamentally false. I hope to write an article on this for The Third Decade as soon as I can find the time.

Third, I assume all worked out well with the newspapers regarding Ragano's FBI statements. I failed to see anything mentioned of it in Newsday but perhaps I missed it, although I do not believe that is so. I asked the Florida reporter to send me a copy of his article but as of yet I have not received any copy, have you?

Finally, lately I have been appearing on several radio and television programs regarding the assassination. All of them have gone quite well. I have been using the information you gave me regarding Ragano and, in fact, I dispatched a letter to Robert Blakey asking him to explain which of Ragano's statements are true and why he believes that to be so? I will be appearing on a radio program this Thursday to specifically discuss the legal aspects of Oswald's defense. The radio station is attempting to convince David Belin to act as the prosecutor. I will let you know how events transpire.

Hope all is well. I look forward to hearing from you soon.
