sunject: Zapruder Film of the Assassination of President Kennedy

Agreence is made to your memorandum of January 14, 1964 instructing that you be informed the details as to the circumstances under faith we seemed cony of original color film taken by Abraham Zapruder, which original film was purchased by Life ingraine.

Just as soon as the President, Vice President Johnson end Texas Governor -- Commaily were in the Perkland Mospital, Dellas, Texas, at approximately 12:45 P. M., November 22, 1953, I proceeded to Texas School Book Depository Building for the purpose of trying to locate withesses. Some withesses were located and were taken to the Sheriff's office which is acress the street from the above named building in order that written statements might by obtained from them. While I was in the Sheriff's office, Harry McCorneks a reporter for the Davies Morning Housy contacted me and informed me that he had iccorned a man PRO ESE mode some movies that he thought we would be interested in. Is then tick is to the office of Mr. Moraber Syperitor, Crass intellecturer, Januarer Durious, Inc., 501 Elm St., Dellas, Cax., who was introduced to me by Mr. Madormank Mr. Sepreder was emotionally upset at the time as he had personally seen Prosident Rennedy shot while taking movies of the Prosident in the notoresie. From Houston and Elm Streets to the underpass vest of the Texas Salical Book Depository Building. Mr. Seprender agreed to Surmich to with a copy of this film with the understanding that it was strictly for official use of the Secret Service and that it would not be shown or given to any newspapers or regarines as he expected to sell the fills for as high a price as he could get for it. Mr. McCorreck was also interested in the film and had offered Mr. Maproduer \$1,000.00 for it, but there were others that were also interested. Accompanied by Mr. McCorrack we took Mr. Zapruder to the Dallas Morning Days . each to their radio station offices in an effort to got the film developed, however, they were not equipped to do so, but did ascertain that Enstead Weigk Company in Rallas could develop the film immediately. We then took Wr. Zapruser to the Eastman Rocak Company where he may arrangements to have the film developed and also copies made of same." Later I went to Mr. Zapandar's cilice end he gave to me two copies of this film, one copy of which was immediately eimmiled to Chief and one copy was retained by me. At the time Mr. Engrader. gave is the copies of the film he had not sold the original film. When he gave so the two copies of the film he egain specified that the film was for government use and that I was not to let either copy get in the hands of any newspaper on magnetime company.

The following day Inspector Kelley obtained the retained come of the film from no which he located to the FBI and which was subsequently returned to Impector Kelley who gave the film to me and it is now in the Delins office.

Dear Sir:

This will confirm agreement reached with your authorized representative, Richard B. Stolley, during the past few days wherein I have agreed to sell, transfer and assign to Time, Inc. all my right, title and interest (whether domestic, foreign, news-reel, television, motion picture or otherwise) in and to my original and all three (3) copies of 8 mm. color films which show the shooting of President John F. Kennedy in Dallas, Texas, on November 22nd, 1963.

You acknowledge receipt through your agent of the original and one (1) copy thereof, and it is understood that there are two (2) other copies, one (1) of which is with the Secret Service in Dallas, Texas, and one (1) copy of which is with the Secret Service in Washington, D. C. I have the assurance and agreement of the Secret Service that the copies in their possession are to be released only to me, and I agree that I shall, immediately upon receipt of same, deliver same to your office or to such of your authorized representatives as you designate, or I will agree to sign any authorization allowing same to be delivered directly to you.

It is understood and agreed that you have all rights attached to said film of any kind and character whatsoever and may use them as you see fit upon terms and conditions set forth hereinafter:

\$25,000.00 cash immediately, and the balance of \$125,000.00 to be paid in installments as follows:

\$25,000.00 on January 3rd, 1964, \$25,000.00 on January 3rd, 1965, \$25,000.00 on January 3rd, 1966, \$25,000,00 on January 3rd, 1967, and \$25,000.00 on January 3rd, 1968.

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In addition to the above consideration it is further agreed and understood that you will pay to me a sum equal to one-half (1/2) of all gross receipts derived by Time, Inc., its presently considered divisions and its wholly owned subsidiary from Like Brown Like Br

\$25,000.00 or such lesser amount as may then be due shall be paid on January 3rd, 1969, and a similar payment of \$25,000.00 or such lesser amount as may then be due annually thereafter, upon the 3rd day of January of each calendar year thereafter, until this agreement shall cease and terminate by the terms hereof.

It is, however, understood that Time, Inc. and its presently constituted divisions, as well as its wholly owned subsidiary Time-Life Broadcast, Inc., shall have unlimited free use on its own behalf of the subject matter.

- (2) This contract and agreement shall last for the life of any copyrights taken out by you and/or the undersigned in connection with said film, plus any times called for by renewals. You agree to indemnify and hold me harmless of and from any claims and expenses in connection with claims arising out of your use, dissemination and distribution of the film, and further agree not to use my name in connection with any such issue or publication without my prior, written consent. You further agree that you shall furnish me with a certified audited report of the auditing firm of your company showing the total gross receipts derived from said film each calendar year or at such other times as may be agreed upon hereafter.
- (3) It is further understood and agreed that in the event you shall sell or transfer all rights to this film, such sale shall be subject to the terms of this agreement and same shall be binding upon the purchaser thereof. Furthermore, should Time, Inc. transfer or assign either the print media rights, in their entirety, or the film for motion picture, television, news reel, etc. dissemination, publication or viewing, in their entirety,

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any such sale shal! likewise bind the purchaser thereof to the aforementioned provisions concerning payment of one-half (1/2) of the gross receipts from exhibition, publication, licensing, renting, or other publication of said film.

- (4) Time, Inc. further agrees that it will present said film to the public in a manner consonant with good taste and dignity and agrees to exercise its best business judgment in the presentation, sale, leasing, licensing and rental of said film consonant with your business custom and practice for the production of gross receipts therefrom.
- (5) I warrant that I am the sole owner of this film and that I have not and will not grant any rights to any other person, corporation or entity, and will agree to accord to you all rights in connection with same and cooperate with you to the fullest extent to secure same.
- (6) Time, Inc. agrees to obtain, at its expense, such copyright protection, domestic and foreign, as it may deem necessary or proper for its own safety and to prevent any infringement thereof, should the same be necessary.
- (7) Anything to the contrary herein notwithstanding, neither I nor my heirs shall have any right to sell, transfer, assign, pledge, hypothecate, mortgage, encumber, or in any way dispose of this contract or any of the payments specified herein or the proceeds hereof nor to receive payment at any time other than as specified herein, nor shall you have any right to make any payments in advance.

Dear Henry: .

Reference is made to your letter of January 7, 1964, concerning the two copies of the Zapruder assassination film now in the hands of the Secret Service.

I find that Mr. Sorrels of our Dallas office, after learning of the existence of the film, called upon Mr. Zapruder in his office, at which time Mr. Zapruder agreed to furnish him with a copy of the film with the understanding that it was strictly for official use of the Secret Service and that it would not be shown or given to any newspapers or magazines, as Mr. Zapruder expected to sell the film.

Mr. Sorrels ascertained that Eastman Kodak Company in Dallas would develop the film immediately. Mr. Sorrels then took Mr. Zapruder to Eastman Kodak where arrangements were made to have the film developed and copies made. Afterward, Mr. Zapruder; in his office, furnished Mr. Sorrels two copies of the film and we received them before Mr. Zapruder had sold the original film.

We, of course, have no knowledge concerning life's later arrange-ment with Mr. Zapruder; however, when we received the film from Mr. Zapruder he again specified that it was for Government use. The film has not been shown to anyone outside the Secret Service, except to members of the staff of the President's Commission on the Assassination.

Please be assured that it will not be shown by us to anyone outside the Government unless for official investigative purposes. However, we consider it part of the official Secret Service file of the investigation of the assassination of President Kennedy.
