The Central Intelligence Agency is not a party to this suit and thus, not technically obligated to respond to the plaintiff's interrogatories. Since, however, the Agency can provide information relating to the substance of the interrogatories, the Agency will provide a pertinent affidavit in lieu of response to the interrogatories.


The Agency affidavit will deal, partially or in entirety, with the substance of the following interrogatories: 70, 71, 73-75, 78, 99, 101, 106, 108, 110, 111, 113-115, 124, 126, 133, 180, 185, 190 and 191.

The Agency will object, partially or in entirety, to the substance of the following interrogatories: 64-66, 68, 69, 71, 74, 76, 77, 80, 87, 94, 102-106, 112, 113, 116-123, 125, 127-132, 134-153, 156-184 and 190.

The interrogatories not cited above have either been answered satisfactorily by the responses of the representatives of the National Archives or do not relate to any matter within the sphere of responsibility of the Agency.

The research and coordination that will be necessary to collect the information for the affidavits will require considerable time. We suggest you request a stay of 60 days in which to complete the task.
