Dear Dave,

Verry glad to get your mailing of the Int. Sec hrg with the misc. items. Let me please make a few suggestions:

Use airmail on only what seems to be urgent. Right now end until after the N.O. trial, for the most part, it will be what might relate to that, directly. I really havn't time to write but I'd do want you to know, if I do not respond, that I'd do appreciate the useful things you are sending. When you use airmail, be certain you have the correct postage. If you do not (and your last five mailings did not) that does slow it down. The rate is 10¢ per ounce.

If there is something as voluminous as a hearing, brief as the Ethel one is, I do not now have time to even glance at it, though I did this one. If there is something you think warrants immediate attention, please include a note to that effect. Or, if you have read it yourself, as you have this one, if you can, a brief summary.

In about a week I will be leaving for New Orleans. When I do I will be gone for the duration of the trial. When I return there will be an enormous accumulation. So, to save yourself time and trouble and a few pennies, unless there is something really pressing, accumulate it, until the end of the trial. Then, with this kind of material, there is a special rate, special fourth class educational. This rate is but 12¢ for the first pound and six additional, the same as for books. It can be insured, and it can be sent special handling, which carries it as though it were 1st class.

You probably had not gotten my note when you sent this. It is important to include sources, such as your valuable sheet on the addressees of the Latin American Report. If you can do that one again, in each case indicating the source, I'd like to send it to a few friends also interested.

Speaking of friends, one of mine out your way may ask you for help in a rush research project and suggested if help is needed you be called upon. I hope, if they do, you can and are willing.
