Earlier today Mr. Alan Thompson of the Declassification Division talked to Mr. Charles Savage of your staff concerning a request submitted to the National Archives by the Senate Select Committee to Study Governmental Operations with Respect to Intelligence Activities for copies of 23 documents located in the records of the Warren Commission.
