## Warren Panel, Under Attacks, Stands Firm on Its:

On the third anniversary of President John F. Kennedy's assassination today, the twoyear-old Warren Commission re port on his death is the subject of intensive attacks. But commission members uphold their findings that a lone assassin, Lee Harvey Oswald, was guilty.

Malcolm Kilduff, acting White House press secretary on the fateful day in Dallas, upholds the finding against Oswald as the lone killer. He does this in a taped Westinghouse Broadcasting Company interview to be aired today.

But Mr. Kilduff disputes the commission theory that a bullet that he said was "in almost perfect condition" could have hit both President Kennedy and Gov. John B. Connally Jr. of Texas.

Earl Warren, Chief Justice of the United States, the commission's chairman, is still declining public comment, his office said yesterday. But Newsweek magazine quoted the 75-yearold Justice yesterday as having


