Dear Barry,

Thanks for your letter of the 6th, which arrived yesterday.

If you have any of the publicity material, anything besides the pictures, I'd like the same number of copies of that. I will want to send a copy to the paper who will try and see the one I will interview, and to my wife.

I am not yet certain when I will go to New Orleans. If you do not send this by Thursday or Friday of the week before, please send one copy to me c/o Louis Vot, Office of the District Attorney, #2700 Tulane Ave., New Orleans, the other to my home.

It is not possible to estimate the length of the trial. I suppose I'll be there that long plus a few days. I will give your message to report you are helping.

If you can find the time to work at the Archives, I suggest you work on the staff papers. Pick something that interests you or discuss it with Gary. In short, I would say pick the Dowdell files, which should be among the longest and very well be loaded with crap. If you do, keep a record of every file and every document in it and please send me a copy of, if you can, the copies. Gary will have a typewriter you can use. I'll send a copy to Gary and one to a dozen or others who are doing similar work. Lease, instead of just making notes, get xeroxes of the interesting papers. We can then duplicate and distribute them. If you arrive in a vehicle for your files you will want to go over on Saturday, they can be left in the search room for you.

Give me what else you may have on the Youngblood 1961 Los Angeles arrest and I'll see if I can get it checked locally. Go to Archives later, please.

Forgot about Jackson. I was in police, had a long interview with him, on tape, and he was somewhat helpful. Sorry I can't get into it. His parents are so terrified he did not even introduce them. I didn't see them.

Thanks for everything. No no - expect letters from H.C. There will not be many.
