Preyer's Cuba Trip Reported 'Productive'

GREENSBORO, N.C. (UPI)—Rep. L. Richardson Preyer (D-N.C.), chairman of the House subcommittee investigating the murder of John F. Kennedy, said yesterday that a five-day trip he has just concluded to Cuba resulted in "productive and useful" interviews with new witnesses.

In a statement issued through his office, Preyer did not go into detail. But he said the witnesses had not been previously questioned by the Warren Commission, which first investigated the Kennedy assassination, because U.S.-Cuban relations were bad at the time of the murder.
