Б	RE:	INTERVIEW WITH LORAN HALL

On March 12, 1968 at 7:30 PM I met LORAN EUGENE HALL at his motel. He was registered at the Hollywood Hills Motel 7140 Sunset Blvd., Room #7. We met there and subsequently went to Tana's restaurant where we discussed the following information and reviewed the FBI reports regarding himself, the SYLVIA ODIO incident, WILLIAM SEYMOUR, and LAWRENCE HOWARD.

HALL stated that the FBI report dated 9/23/64 was inaccurate in its mention of one KIKI FERROR as being the person"he got in touch with" He stated that he was in touch with a Cuban named HERRERA. HERRERA, according to HALL, had been in the Anti-Castro group designated "2506 BRIGADE" and that his father owned a sugar plantation near Mexicali, Mexico. HALL stated that it was HERRERA not FERROR who was employed by the TEXAS OPTICAL CO. in Dallas, Texas.

HALL stated that he knew he had never seen SYLVIA ODIO because he has seen a photograph of her with her four children, shown to him by JERRY COHEN (of the Los Angeles Times) and LAWRENCE SCHILLER (of either Life Magazine, the Los Angeles Times or who knows what). He stated that he could not recall if it was COHEN or SCHILLER because both men had visited him and shown him photographs.

HALL stated that during his interrogation by SA LEON F. BROWN he had been asked if he had met SYLVIA ODIO in Dallas. He said that it was "possible" he had but that he had no recollection of that. The agent then asked him if he could have been at a Magellen Circle, apartment A and HALL repeated CONFIDENTIAL

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that it was "possible" because he had visited people trying to secure funds for his Anti-Castro activities. He made it clear to me that he could not rule out the possibility and for that reason he told the Agent (BROWN) that it was possible. The report dated 9/23/64 is incorrect when it says "HALL stated that this Cuban woman lived...." because at no time did he indicate that as a fact.

8 The FBI report says "HALL said that a Dallas resident 9 had made available \$5,000 which HALL put up for bail, and that 10 they were released." HALL stated that he knew nothing of the 11 bail at the time of their release. He was under the assumption 12that the charges had been dropped at the time of their release. 13 After their release, they were taken to a young attorney's office 14 in Dallas. HALL had never seen this man before and does not re-15 member his name. The attorney said that they should go straight 16 to the YMCA where LESTER LOGUE had arranged a room for them. 17 (Consider this in the light of their having been signed in as 18 HALL and HOWARD)

HALL stated that he knows KIKI FERRER well, has had dinner at his home twice in Miami, Florida, and that KIKI will have no part in his brother, ROLANDO'S activities. KIKI is a dentist, HALL says, and is not interested in participating in the Anti-Castro activities although he is in sympathy with the activities. KIKI helped indirectly but never was in direct contact with the activities.

HALL stated that while the report indicates that he mentioned the "Isle of Pines," neither he nor agent BROWN ever mentioned the Isle of Pines during the entire interrogation.

HALL also told mc that until our meeting he had never
seen these documents (CD 1553).

S1HALL stated that in the document which quotes him32as having recalled that"the three of them, HALL, HOWARD and

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SEYMOUR, had gone to the apartment of a Cuban woman " is totally inaccurate as the three of them were never in Dallas together. HALL had been there with HOWARD and at a separate time he was there with SEYMOUR but never with both at the 1 same time. (See Page three, 9/23/64, dictated 9/17/64). HALL 5 continued that where the report says that "they" had "been in 6 Dallas about three or four days when he and SEYMOUR were arrested 7 and held by the police," that is false. Not only were the three 8 of them not there at the same time but that the arrest of him-9 self and SEYMOUR took place on the morning after the evening they 10 arrived. They had arrived at about 8 PM and were arrested at about 11 9 AM the next morning having talked to no one in the interim. 12

13 HALL stated in regard to his willingness to go to 14 New Orleans to talk to District Attorney, Jim Garrison, this was 15 now, perfectly agreeable to him. He would wait until he got some 16 of his strength back (He was discharged around the end of FEBRUARY 17 1968 from the Veterans Administration Hospital in Los Angeles 18 on Sawtelle Ave.) and until he had a Doctor's clearance. He 19 further stated that he trusted me and would agree to any arrangment 20 we would make for his trip. He said that he wanted to testify, 21 under oath, and that he would cooperate in any way possible. When 22I asked why this had seemed to be contrary to his attitude before 23 he said for two reasons he had fought his extradition as a mater-24 ial witness. First, he was visited, the night before his California 25 hearing, by LAWRENCE SCHILLER, JERRY COHEN, and one other man 23and they said to him that he would be charged for contempt of 27court or perjury and thrown in jail for five years if he went 28 to New Orleans. They told him that "Garrison is some kind of a nut" and urged that he not go to New Orleans under any circumstances. Secondly, since his hearing he had had to pay \$1500.00 in attorney's fees and had been suddenly stricken with a serious ailment. This, he feared, might have been caused by one of Garridon

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men or by someone who did not want him to testify in New Orleans. 1 I asked HALL why his wife had had such a puzzlingly 2 negative reaction to the letter sent to him by Jim Garrison. This 3 was the letter hand carried to his home (and to his wife) by Ą. JACK HOUSTON. He told me that he had nothing but contempt for 5 "CORKY" because he was told by his wife that "CORKY" had scared 6 her with the letter. HOUSTON had apparently presented it to her 7 as if he was a GARRISON staff member. When she questioned this 8 HOUSTON phoned the office in NEW ORLEANS and spoke to ASST. D.A. 9 JAMES ALCOCK which MRS. HALL took to be an affirmation of HOUSTON 10 word of being a staff member. This frightened her further because 11 she felt that HOUSTON had been spying on them all along and was 12 trying to get HALL in trouble. HALL confirmed that at the time 13 of the letter's transport he was in the hospital but that now he 14 had read it and its contents supported the truth that GARRISON 15 was willing to cooperate with him. He felt that now, having read 16 the letter, having talked with HAROLD WEISBERG, BILL TURNER, AL 17 SCHWARTZ (Citizen's Committee of Inquiry) and myself that he had 18 nothing to fear in traveling to New Orleans. He not only looks 19 forward to doing that but he said that since reading the TURNER 20 article in RAMPARTS he can fill in some important information and 21 identities of subjects GARRISON is interested in. 22 23

I showed HALL a photo of the second man in the "warkin men" Photograph. He could not identify this man. Later, I asked h: if he had ever heard the name, CLINTON HAMPTON. HALL said, yes" immediately and gave me the following information.

> Description: 40 years old (in 1963) 5'5 or 5'6" tall Dark complexion

Association: HALL had met him in Miami. He said HAMPTO was an "INSTRUCTOR" and was possibly CIA. HALL had me HAMPTON two times after having been referred by two Cuban women (lesbians, according to HALL) in a well known bar which he frequented. (Gave no name of the b

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HAMPTON told HALL at the time of their meeting that he might get him in on a "GREEN LIGHT RAID running boats for the CIA."

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I asked HALL whether or not he was working for EDGAR EUGENE BRADLEY, soliciting funds from WALLACE FOR PRESIDENT campaign centers. I told him that the office had had an anonymous call to this effect and that it had seemed impossible at the time but that we wanted to have his reaction. He said he would be the last one in the world to do a thing like that at this point because he wants to be as far away from BRADLEY as he possibly can. He wants no part of BRADLEY and states that he believes it's very possible that BRADLEY might be involved in some way in the Assassination. This is purely speculation on his part other than his knowledge of BRADLEY'S acquaintances during the early part of 1963. HALL stated that he was definitely present at a meeting at CLINT WHEAT'S Los Angeles apartment on Lafayette Pl. in 1963 where others present were EDGAR EUGENE BRADLEY, ED COLLINS, COL. GAIL (GAYLE?), AND DR. STANLEY DRENNAN. He said that he would definitely state this under oath.

I asked HALL if he had reason to believe that there wa anyone who might want to get him in trouble. He said there could be many possibilities for that. At a point later in our conversation, I asked HALL how he got along with GERRY PATRICK (HEMMING). He said that for the most part he had always gotten along well with PATRICK. He considered him a "helluva nice guy" and thought that PATRICK was his friend. When I asked if he thought PATRICK might be the one who gave the tip about him being a solicitor for the BRADLEY DEFENSE FUND, HALL said that only one thing would make him believe that to be a possibiltiy. An incident occured in 1963 which involved himself and PATRICK.

PATRICK had sold, or rather "hocked" a rifle with DICK HATHCOCK, an ABC-TV reporter in Los Angeles. HATHCOCK has

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recently done television interviews with ROGER CRAIG, and, I 1 believe with D.A. JIM GARRISON. The rifle remained in HATHCOCK'S 2 possession until a conversation between HALL and HATHCOCK brought 3 out that HATHCOCK was going to sell the rifle to anyone he could. A HALL told him that he would like to buy it from him if he didn't 5 have to keep it for PATRICK. Soon after, HALL purchased the rifle 6 from HATHCOCK for the sum of \$50.00 . Thereafter, when HALL was 7 in Florida, PATRICK phoned him and threatened him if he did not 3 hand over the rifle. HALL rejected the threat., 9

A few days later when HALL went to a specific local or 10 the beach to acquire a boat for a forthcoming raid he was accomp-11 anied by a Cuban friend of his. While they were attaching the boa 12 to the trailer, the Cuban said, "Look up in that house, it's PAT-13 RICK. HALL looked but didn't see anyone. That evening HALL and 14 his friend were arrested by U. S. Customs Officials. At that time 15 the customs officials told HALL that they had known about his 16 activities from the time he picked up the boat. Someone, they 17 boasted, had called them at 2:30 PM (HALL said this was just 18 about the time they got the boat.

At the conclusion of our meeting HALL told me that we would be in touch upon his next trip to Los Angeles and that he would help in any way he could if there was anything he could do I told him I would arrange his trip whenever he was ready.

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
