THE LEGAL ACTION WAS BROUGHT BY HAROLD WEISBERG; BUTHOR OF FOUR BOOKS ON THE ASSASSINATION. HE HAD ASKED THE FBI FOR ITS SPECTROGRAPHIC SHALYSIS OF BUL-LET FRAGMENTS FOUND AT THE SCENE OF THE KENNEDY SHOOTING. IN DALLAS ON Nov. 22, 1983. THE FRI REFUSED THE REQUEST ON GROUNDS THE EVIDENCE WAS PART OF "INVESTIGATORY FILES COMPILED FOR LAW ENFORCEMENT PURPOSES" AND THUS EXEMPT FROM THE FREEDOM OF INFORMA-TION ACT. THE ACT IS INTENDED TO FORCE GOVERNMENT AGENCIES TO PROVINE THE PUBLIC WITH OFFICIAL DOCUMENTS ON REQUEST. HEISBURG S ATTORNEYS ARGUED

THAT THE ACT PLACED THE BURDEN ON THE FBI OF SHOULING HHY THE EVIDENCE SHOULD NOT BE REVERSED IN CASES WHERE ""NO PROSECUTION 15 CONTEMPLATED AND DISCLOSURE HOULD NOT HARM THE AGENCY S LEGITINATE LAW ENFORCEMENT FUNCTIONS. " "

THE LOWER COURTS SAID HOWEY-ER THAT THE FBI HAD HET ITS. OBLIGHTIONS BY PROVIDING AN AFFIDAVIT FROM A SPECIAL AGENT, SAYING RELEASE OF THE INFORMA-

I am extremely interested in the J.F.K. assassination, and would be most anxious to receive word from you if you develop anything new - particularly something that can be written or presented in form for radio.

Again, let me say how much I anjoyed and respected your book -Whitewash. I intend in the near future to read your other works too.
