The Anderson Papers, by Jack Anderson with George Clifford (Ballantine, \$1.75). In addition to the hardcover edition's material on ITT, Watergate, the Eagleton fiasco, the FBI and the Bangladesh war, the paperback edition of the muckraker's memoirs has a new section entitled "The Seeds of the Impeachment."

Indispensable Enemies: The Politics of Misrule in America, by Walter Karp (Penguin, \$2.95). A searching, controversial and rather pessimistic look at structures, personalities and goals in the "bipartisan oligarchy" that controls American political processes. Karp argues eloquently that the leaders of our major political parties are motivated more by the objective of retaining power than by the needs of the nation or even of the parties. The paperback edition has the mandatory new chapter on Watergate.
