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No matter who occupies the White House, it has become clear that Henry Kissinger is still "indispensable." But just who is this German immigrant who has become the most celebrated diplomat of our time?

As the diplomatic and Far Eastern correspondents of CBS News, Marvin Kalb and Bernard Kalb have seen the public—and the private—Kissinger as few other men have, and their lively, shrewdly incisive biography gives us a penetrating portrait of his life and career.
