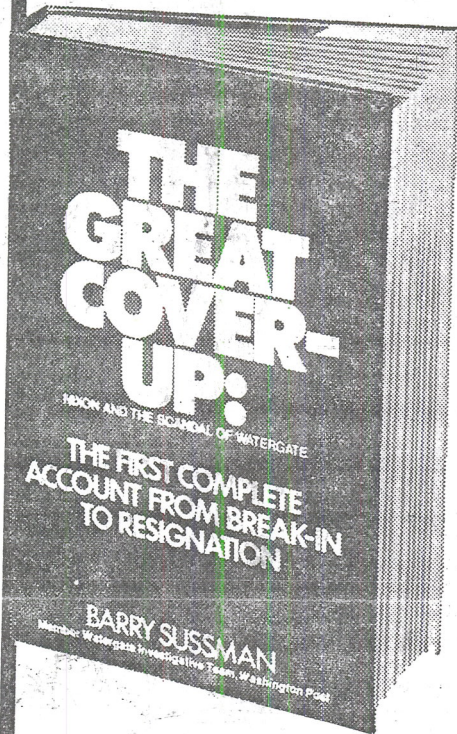
This is Barry Sussman. Editor of the Year, 1973.**

Barry Sussman was an editor on the *Washington Post's* Pulitzer Prize-winning Watergate investigation. He was the behind-the-scenes investigator, the inside source people turned to for advice.
