Walters, nevertheless, carried out the White House orders and spoke to Gray about tapering the investigation. Subsequently, the CIA resisted White House pressure to participate in the Water gate cover-up.

The CIA memos also entangle President Nixon in the coverup. Haldeman said the intervention with the FBI "was the President's wish." Of course, Haldeman may have misused the President's name. But it took another 10 months for a reluctnat Mr. Nixon to fire Haldeman and Ehrlichman. Then he praised them in the process.
