## Greyhound Fined \$5,000 For Campaign Spending

WASHINGTON — Greyhound Corp.
was fined \$5,000 for making illegal contributions to the 1972 presidential campaigns of Richard Nixon and George
McGovern.

The fine, the maximum allowed under the law barring corporate donations to campaigns for federal office, was assessed by Judge Oliver Gasch of the federal district court here.

Greyhound pleaded guilty Oct. 2 to a charge that it gave a total \$16,040 to the two campaigns. The Watergate Special Prosecutor's Office said the company arranged the contributions by encouraging senior corporate officials to give personal funds to the presidential candidate of their choice and then awarding each executive a bonus of twice the contribution,
