

Snoop Case Due After Elections

WASHINGTON — (UPI) — Attorney General Richard G. Kleindienst said last night the FBI investigation of alleged criminal violations in fund raising for President Nixon's re-election campaign will not be completed until after the Nov. 7 election.

"I'm sure that no one would want the FBI to do such a quick investigation, just in order to satisfy somebody's desire to have it heard before the election because if they did that then they would be accused of . . . a whitewash," Kleindienst said.

Kleindienst made the disclosure only hours after the U.S. district court ruled that "it will be impossible" to hear three civil damages suits springing from the Watergate bugging case before election day.

Judge Charles R. Richey ordered the civil suits to be held up until the criminal prosecution of seven men charged with breaking in

and bugging Democratic National Headquarters June 17 is completed.

After meeting five hours with attorneys for Democrats and Republicans, Richey ordered depositions in the three civil damage suits be stayed while criminal proceedings are underway.
