The water is now warmer than it has been all year, which tells you how hot the air has been. ... Found one kid who is coping with the problems today's kids have that our generation had much less often, parents who didn't want her. And thus met my first Jesus Freak. This girl, who our trouble-ridden nephew met, came for supper with him last night. Both parents had beaten her all her

life. So, at 14, she went out on her own. How she makes a living baby sitting I can't see. Some family must be keeping her. I didn't ask. But now she is working her way through the local community college. I think that would be rather good for a boy, whose employment opportunities are better and are paid at a higher rate. For a girl I think it is fine. Only there was no Jesus stuff. No effort to save us.
