An exhibit entered by attorneys for American Indian Movement (AIM) leaders Dennis Banks and Russell Means in U.S. District Court today included a signed statement in which Mr. Nixon refused to respond to a May 2 suppoena.

Attorneys for Banks and Means have maintained there were White House conversations regarding Wounded Knee in March, 1973, during the course of the 71-day siege. The lawyers said they learned from former presdential counsel John Dean that conversations may have been recorded.
