
Mansfield Sees Balance For Congress and Ford

WASHINGTON, Aug. 12 (AP) — Mike Mansfield, the Senate majority leader, said today that Congress would try to restore the constitutional balance between the legislative and executive branches during President Ford's term.

"We do not want to dominate any President but we do want to be equal as the document prescribes," Mr. Mansfield, Democrat of Montana, said on the NBC TV program "Today." He said the executive branch had reached the pinnacle of its domination over Congress during the first three months of the second term of President Nixon.
