Judge Bars Voting List

BALTIMORE (AP)—Baltimore County election judges have been barred by a federal court order from furnishing lists of persons who vote Tuesday to representatives of the Committee For The Re-election of the President.

Atty. Gen. Francis B. Burch said he would tell Anne Arundel and Howard county officials to abide by the order which dealt specifically with Baltimore County.

The suit was filed by supporters of Sen. George S. McGovern.

According to the suit, Reoublican election judges would have provided carbon copies of persons who voted to campaign officials. The Republicans would compare the list of those who voted against lists of voters known to be favorable to President Nixon. Pro-Nixon voters who had not come to the polls would be contacted and urged to turn out.

Stephen Sachs, who argued the case Monday, said the practice violated equal protection guarantees since all election subdivisions were not able to provide such lists.

Charles A. Pryor, the county election supervisor, said the proposed practice did not violate Gov. Marvin Mandel's 1970 order agains election judges taking part in partisan political activities.
