In another Watergate-related development yesterday, Murray M. Chotiner, longtime political adviser to President Nixon, denied reports that he ordered secret reports on drug and sexual activities by McGovern aides in the 1972 presidential campaign. While confirming that he paid a woman journalist \$1,000 a week for nine or 10 weeks to keep the McGovern campaign under political surveillance, Chotiner said, "There is nothing in the reports for which anyone need be ashamed."

Lucianne Cummings Goldberg was highly paid, Chotiner said in a telephone interview from the Balboa Bay Club in Newport Beach, Calif., because it was a short-term arrangement and she was on call 24 hours a day.

"We wanted the size of the crowds and their reactions to what the candidate said," Chotiner added.

Chotiner said he planned to offer Mrs. Goldberg's reports to the Ervin committee.
