

Nixon on conspiracy to assassinate JFK, San Clemente press conference 8/22/72

"But if he [Robert Kennedy] had had 10 more [wire taps] and as a result of wiretaps had been able to discover the Oswald plan it would have been worth it."

"Let me correct you, sir. I ~~was~~ ^{want} to be sure that the assumption is correct. I said if 10 more wiretaps could have found the conspiracy, if it was a conspiracy, or the individual, then it would have been worth it. As far as I'm concerned, I'm no more of an expert on that assassination than anybody else, but my point is that wiretaps, in the national security area were very high in the Kennedy Administration for a very good reason."

It is not possible to suggest that any wiretap could have detected a non-conspiracy unless one postulates that Oswald used the phone to call himself and to talk to himself only. Unless he talked to someone else, there could not possibly have been any exposure or any disclosure by wiretapping. If he talked to someone else, there was a conspiracy.

Nixon is a lawyer and knows that he was alleging ~~was~~ a conspiracy and nothing else. Or he was defrauding everyone, believing there was no conspiracy and making a knowingly invalid case to pretend that wiretaps are good and proper.
