

Dem office maps, 'bug' reported

WASHINGTON (UPI) — Authorities investigating the break-in of Democratic national headquarters found maps of the premises and a dismantled eavesdropping device in the desk of a White House consult-

ant, the Washington Daily News said today.

According to Daily News reporter Patrick Collins, the floor plans of the Democratic offices, the bugging device and a Spanish-made automatic pistol turned up in the desk of

Howard E. Hunt in the Executive Office Building adjacent to the White House.

Hunt's name cropped up in connection with the five men arrested in the early morning hours of June 10 at the Democratic headquarters. One of

the five had been an employe of the Republican National Committee and the Committee for the Re-Election of the President.

Hunt's name showed up in an address book found on one of the five. He has sometimes

worked as a consultant to Charles Colson, a White House aide.

Collins said Hunt's desk was located in Colson's office. He added that sources said the bugging device was similar to those found on the five men

arrested at the Democratic headquarters.

Hunt, 51, a writer and public relations man, was working on a consultant basis on the declassification of the Pentagon Papers and on narcotics law enforcement.
