None of the news accounts of Mr. Hunt's testimony included any of his opening statement, which I found interesting in listening to it.

If you have a copy to spare, I would appreciate it.

If you want it returned, I'll go over it and return it, as soon as you say if the copies are few.

I do wish you well in this ~~xxx~~ representation for as I indicated earlier, I do believe that justice must be equal or it is not justice.

Recently there have been accounts of a "biography" of Mr. Hunt that should be appearing soon, by Tad Szulc, who seems to have been saying he knew Mr. and Mrs. Hunt years ago, in Paris. I have no knowledge of this but am aware of Mrs Helms' indirect comment.

While I do not presume to anticipate how Mr. Hunt will feel about a book I have not read, I am familiar with Mr. Szulc's recent writings that are relevant. Based on this I have obtained a copy of his The Cuban Invasion, done jointly with Karl Meyer. Perhaps from his own interests Mr. Hunt read this book more than a decade ago when it came out. My recent reading leads me to believe that if Mr. Hunt was less than pleased with his Sunday Times Magazine article of some months ago and has no strong recollection of The Cuban Invasion, he may want to read and make his own analysis of it now. It raised a few questions in my mind. Mr. Hunt may not read it the same way. It was published by Praeger. If he would like to borrow a copy, the District library still has it. Or, I can provide a copy of a xerox on which parts of some pages are indistinct.

When I can obtain a copy of the new work, I will be reading it. I do not expect that my analysis at that time will exactly coincide with Mr. Hunt's. However, in the event, what I believe might interest you or him, I will be willing to convey ~~it~~. I am not unfamiliar with the Cuban situation, if the Bay of Pigs is not a major part of my interest. I have researched and when I can will write a book dealing with other matters. In the course of this work I did become friendly with several Bay of Pigs veterans who are not typical of that group. From one of these I obtained what he claims is a first-person account of another work on the Bay of Pigs. If his account is correct, it indicates that all of these books are not completely independent.

Should it interest you or Mr. Hunt, I also have a few pages of FBI reports dealing with some of his former associates in connection with the investigation of the JFK assassination. These reports are indicative of something less than vigorous investigation. I obtained them properly.
