\$1 million suit in crash at Midway

The widow of the assistant comptroller of the University of Chicago, who was killed in the Dec. 8 United Air Lines jet crash, Monday filed a \$1 million damage suit in Circuit Court.

Mrs. Eva Rossman of 18509 Clyde Rd., Homewood, charged United with failure to have proper de-icing equipment on the 737 jet that crashed near Midway Airport, killing 45 persons.

Her suit, filed by attorney Leo S. Karlin, also charged United with negligence in the death of her husband, Willis R., who had held the university post since February, 1969. He also is survived by a son, Michael. The Boeing Co., manufacturer of the jet, was named a co-defendant in the suit.
