

## 'Distressed' But Hopeful

Julie Nixon Eisenhower says she is "not worried" that her father has been named an unindicted co-conspirator in the Watergate coverup case by a federal grand jury.

"I believe in my father and I have a feeling that everything will turn out all right. So does my mother," she said at a reception following a performance of the Royal Ballet in the Kennedy Center Thursday night.

Mrs. Eisenhower told a reporter that "they seem to be out to get my father's two brothers and his great friend Bebe Rebozo," but she did not identify who "they" were. She added that "that distresses us all very much."

Mrs. Eisenhower turned up at the benefit performance of "Manon" after spending the day moving from the Bethesda house she and her husband rented from Rebozo, into a two-bedroom Columbia Plaza apartment opposite the Watergate apartments and the Kennedy Center.

At the ballet, she shared the Presidential Box with Vice President and Mrs. Gerald Ford and the Fords' daughter Susan.

Ford was besieged by autograph seekers at the post-performance reception, sponsored by the American Digestive Disease Society.
