

The library has the correspondence file of the Texas inquiry on microfilm.

I have only a few ~~xxx~~ pages from it, none relevant.

Sylvia Meagher did a good article in The Minority of One, August 1968, based largely on this correspondence, documenting the original plans Texas had for its own investigation, how this was stopped by Warren, the somewhat ~~xx~~ tense relationship between the Commission and Carr (hence J.), etc. Mention's J's ~~xxxx~~ conferences with Katzenbach, Hoover, and Carr after his appointment as Special Counsel for the Texas inquiry.

References to J's attendance at WC testimony (M & M Oswald)

J's address, March 16, 1964, to Trial Lawyers group, Miami Beach.

August '64: Carr & J. insisting on seeing the WR before publication. The WC didn't want the galleys, depositions, etc. leaving DC because of leaks.

From my notes (old) ~~x~~ on the Texas film:

"Mar 16 - Jaworski's version of how LHO was picked up. Far out" (Sic)

From DL notes:

Approx Mar 10 in corr. file: "J to Carr, with xerox copies of Lane's appearance news stories"

Text of J's Mar 16 address (10 pp)

"J to Carr ~~xx~~ May 29, confidential, not important"

"J to Carr, June 3, unimportant"

WR: no index reference

26 vols: 7H332 (Re ltr from Louis Nichols to J. re his interview with LHO about securing counsel; J wanted to talk about it in Miami. If J ~~xxxxxx~~ thought the DPD didn't deprive LHO of ~~xxxx~~ access to counsel, he's off to a great start on Watergate. Presumably he never heard of McDermid's telegram.

SM index: reflects that J attended the testimony of Marguerite and Robert Oswald, FBI agents Frazier, Fain, Quigley, & Hosty, Jack Ruby, and Marina Oswald.

(based on listigga at the start of the transcripts. 1H126,264; 3H390; 4H403; 5H181,387.)

Check of all my book indexes.

Inquest, p. 4 (just named), 39 (Hudkins check, as quoted above)

"Lee", p. 189: just mentions ~~xx~~ J's presence ~~x~~ at Robert O. testimony

Executive sessions: probably have discussion of problems with Texas. No index.

Archives: Not a KP. Probably a bit of correspondence files under his name; all should be in the Texas film file.

CD index check: only CD 1472. ~~xx~~ 113a, interview of Storey re leak of Ruby testimony to Dorothy Kilgallen; J's name mentioned as a participant in the Texas Court of Inquiry, along with Carr and ~~xxx~~ Storey.

Page 113 is the interview of Wade on this subject. ~~x~~ J. was present at this session of June 7, 1964, but he was apparently not interviewed about having been the source of ~~xx~~ this leak (don't know if he had access to the transcripts).

I may have ~~xxx~~ missed something in the index; it seems a bit odd that he wasn't interviewed in any of the leak investigation, altho some of those reports are not indexed. (He may be in CD 1534, which might be interesting.) (Lots of WC people were interviewed; some revealed how little ~~xxx~~ they had to do with anything.)
