The 1962-63 phone directory lists the Cuban Freedom Committee
of the Christian Form at 1737 H Street, N.W. Phone: 298-7155. The
same directory also lists Mullen & Co. at the 1737 H Street
address, phone: ME-8-2526.

Do you have the 2/13/74 Times article on the Chicago Black
Panther's chief of security at the time of the Hampton murder being
a paid FBI agent? If not, I'll make you a copy.

Wrone has been disturbed by a statement in Belin's book (p. 257)
that "the ballistic evidence . . . showed that cartridge cases found
in the southeast corner window . . ., two large ballistically identi-
fiable bullet fragments found in the front seat of the Presidential
limousine, and one nearly whole bullet found at Parkland . . . Hospital
all came from a rifle found near the back stairway of the sixth floor
of the TSBD . . ., to the exclusion of all other weapons in the world."
Wrone has looked all over for support for the claim that the two
fragments are ballistically linked to the so-called Oswald rifle but
says he can't find any evidence to back Belin's claim. Do you know
of any? Does ballistics properly comprehend spectrographic analysis
or neutron activation analysis? If it does not, is it even possible
to ballistically determine the origin of a fragment as having come
from a particular rifle? (Frazier's affidavit in the King assassination
would seem clear indication that it is not possible.)

Bud told me yesterday afternoon that he had a long phone conver-
sation with Richard Ryan. He thinks Ryan is not enthusiastic about
Jimmy's plan to have him file a suit to get him out of isolation and
will probably drop the whole endeavor. In the meantime, I have been
in touch with the National Prison Reform Project here to get some
help in arguing against keeping Ray in isolation. It should be
forthcoming soon, in the form of legal precedents which will aid the
argument and the names of three psychiatrists who can testify as to
the effects of prolonged isolation.
