

Meskill, Silbert Renominated

President Ford resubmitted yesterday 10 nominations that were not acted on by the Senate last year, including the controversial choice of former Connecticut Gov. Thomas J. Meskill to be a judge of the Second U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals.

Also resubmitted was the nomination of Earl J. Silbert, prosecutor of the original Watergate burglary case, to be U.S. Attorney for the District of Columbia.

The other nominations are: Robert J. Corber to the Interstate Commerce Commission; Thomas G. Cody as assistant secretary of Housing and Urban Development; Joseph Latin to be assistant secretary of defense; John William Kauffman of New Jersey and Eddie G. Smith Jr., to the Board of Regents for the National Library of Medicine; Edward E. David Jr. to the board of directors of the Communications Satellite Corp.; John L. Briggs to be U.S. attorney for the middle district of Florida; and Ronald T. Knight to be U.S. attorney for the middle district of Georgia.
