Dear Si:

With the disclosure in this morning's Sun-Times that Clement Stone is investigating how his Nixon money was spent, it is becoming much more important to talk to you about Clarence's activities of March, 1971.

You no doubt have watched the Watergate hearings and, I hope, by now you realize the national significance of what happened with Clarence during that period. Planning of Watergate-type projects at that early date, needless to say, throws an explosively important new dimension on the current hearings.

Any loyalty to Clarence's memory on the scale of intrinsic values falls far short of a clear duty to assist in investigating the background of "pre-Watergate" dirty tricks planning. Don't be guilty, at least morally, of a coverup which can be construed to be no less important than the charges against Mitchell, Haldexman and Erlichman.

Also, wouldn't you feel more comfortable talking to me than to an impersonal federal investigator who likely would not believe that Clarence was not all bad?
