

# Getting Nixon's Papers

The Saturday Evening Post has lost former President Nixon's daughter, but gained some of his papers.

Yesterday was Julie Nixon Eisenhower's last day as an editor for the magazine, working in her office at the Guest Quarters in Washington. But there's a lot of excitement in the home office in Indianapolis, where 4,400 pounds of Nixon letters and papers arrived in 94 boxes, on loan for a story.

Publisher and co-editor Cory SerVaas said the story, which was her idea and would be "on the pro side" to counteract unfavorable stories in other publications, was unconnected with Mrs. Eisenhower's service to the magazine. The papers were sent from Nixon's home in San Clemente, Calif., and have been locked in warehouses until they are examined by a psychiatrist and a psychologist next week.
