Oswald was chased into a movie theater by a patrolman who was shot to death, the police said, by the suspect. Another policeman subdued Oswald, who is 24 years old.

The first sound of the shots, as the President's car moved through Dallas, sounded to witnesses like a glant firecracker. The noise came from tall buildings that the Presidential party had just passed. There were three bursts of shots.

As Mr. Kennedy slumped in his seat, the accompanying poand Secret Service agents suddenly had automatic rifles and pistols in their hands. They were apparently caught off guard by the swiftness of the attack,

Policemen Run Into Park

Several policemen ran to a grassy knoll and into a nearby park behind the Kennedy entourage.

In a search of the buildings in the area, a German-made Mauser rifle was found on a fifth-floor landing of one tall structure. One shell remained in rifle's chamber. shots had been fired.

Within moments, the police received a tip that a man in a brown shirt had just dashed a movie theater a distance from the building where the rifle was found, the Texas School Book Depository

Patrolmen J. D. Tippit and M. N. MacDonald ran into the rear of the theater in close pur-suit. When they spotted the man, Patrolman Tippit fired a shot. It was returned by the suspect, identified as Oswald.

The patrolman was hit by the return fire and died instantly. Patrolman MacDonald rushed Oswald and grappled with him
