DALLAS OUT (200)

DALLAS, NOV. 30 (AP)-SOMEONE TELEGRAPHED SMALL AMOUNTS OF MONEY TO LEE HARVEY OSWALD FOR SEVERAL MONTHS BEFORE THE ASSASSINATION OF PRESIDENT KENNEDY, THE DALLAS TIMES HERALD REPORTED TODAY.

HIS APPEARANCES AT THE WESTERN UNION OFFICE HERE WERE RECALLED BECAUSE OSWALD INVARIABLY ARGUED WITH ITS PERSONNEL, THE NEWSPAPER SAID. IT NAMED NO SOURCE OF INFORMATION BUT GAVE THIS ACCOUNT:

THE UNIDENTIFIED SENDER TELEGRAPHED OSWALD \$10 TO \$20 AT A TIME.

SEVERAL DAYS BEFORE THE NOV. 22 SLAYING OF PRESIDENT KENNEDY, OSWALD SENT A TELEGRAM, WRITING IT IN A CRAMPED SCRIPT. THE ADDRESSEE AND CONTENT OF THE MESSAGE WERE NOT DISCLOSED.

OSWALD WAS REMEMBERED AT THE WESTERN UNION OFFICE AFTER HE APPEARED ON TELEVISION--FIRST WITH POLICE WHO CHARGED HIM WITH MURDERING THE PRESIDENT AND A DALLAS POLICEMAN, AND NOV. 24 WHEN NIGHT SPOT OWNER JACK RUBY SHOT AND KILLED OSWALD AT THE CITY HALL.

AN FBI SPOKESMAN SAID MESSAGES RECEIVED OR SENT BY OSWALD WERE "UNDER ACTIVE INVESTIGATION" BUT ANY DETAILS OR COMMENT WOULD HAVE TO COME FROM WASHINGTON HEADQUARTERS OF THE FEDERAL BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION.
