WITH RUBY (PRECEDE FORT WORTH DAY)

DALLAS, FEB. 10 (AP)-THE DALLAS TIMES HERALD SAID TODAY IT HAS

EARNED THAT TWO HERETOFORE UNDISCLOSED WITNESSES SAW A MAN IN THE SIXTH FLOOR WINDOW OF THE BUILDING FROM WHERE PRESIDENT KENNEDY WAS ASSASSINATED NOV. 22.

THE NEWSPAPER SAID A TEEN-AGE NEGRO BOY AND A CONSTRUCTION WORKER WERE STANDING IN THE STREET WHEN THE FATAL SHOTS WERE FIRED FROM THE TEXAS BOOK DEPOSITORY BUILDING.

LEE HARVEY OSWALD WAS CHARGED WITH THE PRESIDENT'S DEATH LATER, BUT THE TIMES HERALD SAID THE TWO FAILED TO IDENTIFY OSWALD AS THE MAN IN THE WINDOW AFTER VIEWING HIM IN A POLICE LINEUP.

OSWALD WAS SHOT TWO DAYS LATER DURING A JAIL TRANSFER.

THE NEWSPAPER ATTRIBUTED "QUALIFIED SOURCES" WITH KNOWLEDGE OF THE TWO WITNESSES, BUT NEITHER WAS NAMED.

EARLIER TODAY, THE FORT WORTH STAR-TELEGRAM SAID IN A COPYRIGHTED STORY QUOTED AN INFORMED SOURCE AS SAYING THAT A WITNESS NOW UNDER PROTECTIVE CUSTODY COULD IDENTIFY OSWALD AS THE PRESIDENTIAL ASSASSIN.

THE STAR-TELEGRAM SAID THE WITNESS, A NEGRO JANITOR, WOULD APPEAR BEFORE THE WARREN COMMISSION INVESTIGATING THE ASSASSINATION. BUT THE FORT WORTH NEWSPAPER REPORTED THAT GOVERNMENT SPOKESMEN DENIED THIS, AND THAT ITS SOURCE LATER REVISED HIS STORY AFTER IT WAS PUBLISHED.
