About 300 persons gathered in a cold wind at Kennedy Memorial Plaza yesterday for 30 minutes of music and prayer and to eulogize late President John F. Kennedy one day ahead of the tenth anniversary of his assassination.

Mrs. J. B. Shaw, an elder-ty lady who brought a nurse with her and sat with bowed head in a folding chair at a corner of the memorial, summed up in 17 words what a Catholic bishop, a rabbi, a Protestant clergyman and Mayor Wes Wise were to say later.

"I had a special regard for President Kennedy," Mrs. Shaw said shakily. "He was the finest of men-a great leader."

Senator Robert F. Kennedy was killed by an assas-sin's bullet five years ago, during his 1968 campaign for the presidency.

Mrs. Joseph Kennedy, the natriarch of the Kennedy family, is expected to spend the holiday in the south, visiting friends, family spokesmen said.
