Two Irving Men Die In Plane Crash

Two rving men died Punday night when a light plane in which they were passengers plumeted to Zeath in a Missouri River bluff near the Jefferson City, Mon, airport. Two Pallas men also died in the same crash.

The four were key men in the sales department of Thoron Industries of Dallas, according to an official of the firm, and were en route to a sales meeting to be held in St. Louis on Monday.

The crash occurred at 8:02 p.m. CST.

The official stated that the bodes of the men were expected in Dallas about noon Mondah. They are being flown back in a company plane accompanied by Gerald Johansen, director of marketing for Thuron Industries.
