

Two Irving Men Die
In Plane Crash

Two Irving men died Sunday night when a light plane in which they were passengers plummeted to death in a Missouri River bluff near the Jefferson City, Mo., airport. Two Dallas men also died in the same crash.

The Irving men were Tracy D (Bo) Click, 2201 W. Irving Blvd., and Ronald G. Smith, 1815 Morgan. The Dallasites were William J. Hodges and Ben F. Slaughter. The four were key men in the sales department of Thuron Industries of Dallas, according to an official of the firm, and were en route to a sales meeting to be held in St. Louis on Monday.

The crash occurred at 8:02 p.m. CST.

The official stated that the bodies of the men were expected in Dallas about noon Monday. They are being flown back in a company plane accompanied by Gerald Johansen, director of marketing for Thuron Industries.

Moore Funeral Home in Arlington will be in charge of arrangements for Smith, and Ben W. Brown Funeral Home in Irving for Click.

Smith's survivors include his wife, Shirley and two children, and Click is survived by his wife, Jeanene and three children.
