Angola report

NEW YORK — President Ford has squared off against another congressional committee in an effort to block publication of a report involving the escalation of U.S. involvement in Angola, CBS News said yesterday.

CBS correspondent Daniel Schorr said Ford will write to House Intelligence Committee Chairman Otis Pike, invoking the presidential right to veto issuance of the report by certifying that it contains information that would jeopardize national security.

The committee already has approved the five-page draft that Schorr said challenges Secretary of State Kissinger's stand that U.S. action in Angola has been merely a response to a Soviet buildup.

He said the report suggests the CIA's supply of \$300,000 in arms to pro-Western factions in Angola last spring could have been taken by the Russians as a challenge.
