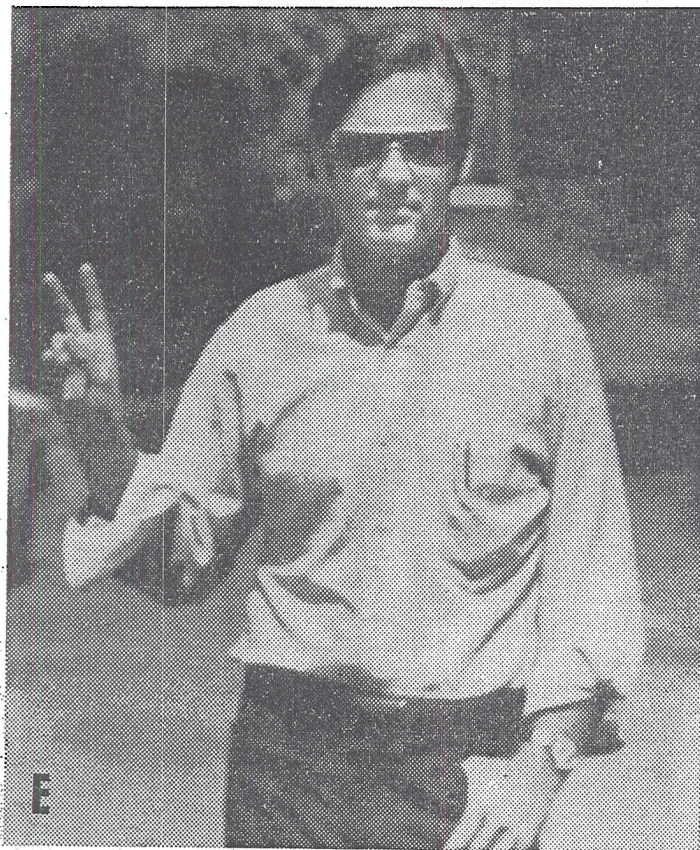
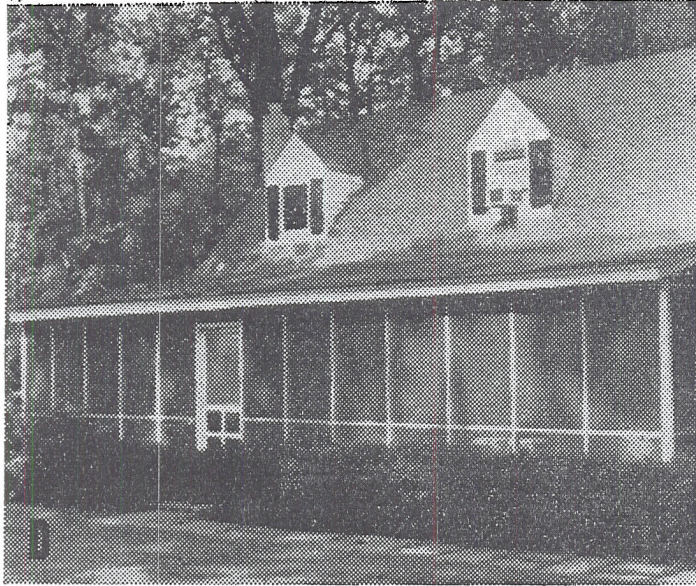

Though the 6 people knew one another, they were not close friends. But each was close to Father Daniel Berrigan, and on the evening of August 17, 1970, they sat on a screened porch in Weston, Conn., discussing his capture of a few days before.

The government charges that during that meeting they formulated a plot to kidnap presidential aide Henry Kissinger.

Through confidential sources, Lee Lockwood pieced together the conversation that took place.

The account, one may assume, is essentially what the defend-

ants will testify in their own defense at their conspiracy trial next fall.
