

Prospective Alternate Juror Accepted in Berrigan Case

HARRISBURG, Pa., Feb. 16
UPI)—A steel mill worker who
said he had strong views that
the United States should with-
draw from Vietnam was ac-
cepted today as a prospective
alternate juror in the Berrigan
trial.

His selection left only two
prospects to be qualified to a
panel of 16 from which six al-
ternate jurors will be drawn to
sit alongside the regular jury of
12 that was sworn more than
a week ago.

The Rev. Philip F. Berrigan,
who is a Catholic priest, and
six other antiwar activists are
charged with conspiring to
blow up heating tunnels in
Washington, to vandalize vari-
ous draft headquarters and to
kidnap Henry A. Kissinger, the
Presidential adviser. They are
on trial in Federal District
Court. The trial is in its fourth
week.
