

A Request for CIA Probe Data

Senator Franch Church (Dem-Ida.), chairman of the Senate intelligence committee, said yesterday he will ask the Rockefeller commission to turn over all information gathered in its investigation alleged illegal domestic spying by the Central Intelligence Agency.

Church also announced that Frederick A. O. Schwarz III, partner in a New York law firm, has been named chief counsel of the Senate committee created to investigate the CIA, FBI and other U.S. intelligence agencies.

Burke Marshall, a former assistant attorney general

for civil rights, has been hired to serve as a consultant to the committee, Church added.

Church said he expected little difficulty in obtaining the records and transcripts compiled by the Rockefeller commission but left little doubt he would subpoena the documents if necessary.

"The Senate committee has full and lawful entitlement" to the commission documents, he said.

The investigation headed by Vice president Nelson A. Rockefeller is restricted to alleged domestic wrongdoings by the CIA.
