The Rockefeller commission yesterday took testimony from six more unidentified witnesses, all described as current employees of the CIA.

A spokesman for the commission, which is investigating charges that the CIA spied illegally on Americans, said all but one of the six are working in or had worked in the office of security — the section of the agency believed to have carried out domestic activity.

Former Treasury Secretary C. Douglas Dillon, who presided over the meeting in the absence of Vice President Nelson Rockefeller, would say only, "the witnesses are from the agency and we're going into technical matters that the staff has uncovered."

Dillon said the commission, which has been asked by President Ford to make a report by April 1, is only halfway through its work.

"If we do need more time, we'll ask for it," Dillon said.
