The CIA fed bacon, eggs and no secrets to a crowd of freshmen Democratic Congressmen today.

The lawmakers, invited to breakfast at the Central Intelligence Agency headquarters in nearby Langley, Va., got a "chalk talk" from director William Colby, according to Representative J. Robert Traxler (Dem-Mich.).

Twenty off the '75 new Democrats responded to Colby's invitation to come out for breakfast and a "briefing."

"He explained the function of an intelligence agency," said Traxler. "He used a little slide projector and gave us a chalk talk — but didn't tell us anything you guys haven't been writing about for the past couple of years.

"We were escorted from the bus to the executive dining room and back to the bus. We didn't see anything. It was worth the trip as far as getting to know them as personalities. Mr. Colby introduced us to some fine gentlemen but there was no information that we didn't already know."
