CIA study nears verdict

WASHINGTON — After an 18 week investigation, the Rockefeller Commission apparently is heading toward a verdict that the CIA clearly broke the law on one or two major occasions but never engaged in extensive illegal domestic spying.

The eight-member panel headed by Vice President Nelson Rockefeller is writing its final report. It will go to President Ford June 6.

Statements by panel members and staff over the past week indicate the report will endorse continuance of a strong and super-secret spy agency operating under more clearly defined prohibitions against domestic activity.

There will not, they said, be any new information about the assassination of President John F. Kennedy.
