→ An article in The New York Times yesterday on proposals to assassinate Premier Fidel Castro of Cuba said erroneously that The Associated Press had reported that, in August, 1962, Robert S. McNamara, then Secretary of Defense, sent a memorandum to the Central Intelligence Agency directing the C.I.A. to prepare a plan for the "elimination" of Mr. Castro. Actually, The Associated Press dispatch said an aide to Mr. McNamara had prepared the memorandum, and that the Secretary denied that he had ever ordered it drawn up.
