

Giancana Records Seized In Hunt for Clues to Killer

CHICAGO, June 25 (UPI)—Investigations Wednesday began digging into seized papers and tape recordings of Sam Giancana, the underworld figure, in a hunt for clues to his killer and for a picture of the workings of the Chicago crime syndicate.

But members of the Giancana family charged that the investigators had seized the mobster's property illegally, and won orders from two judges blocking full examination of the materials pending further court action.

Investigators with a search warrant entered the Giancana home in suburban Oak Park late Tuesday and took away a brown, seven-drawer desk, a metal filing cabinet, a recording machine equipped to record both in-the-room and telephone conversations, and some cassette tapes.

State and Cook County investigators hoped the seized materials might indicate who would have wanted Mr. Giancana killed.
